A Long Path to Justice

Firsthand accounts from survivors of Argentina's "Dirty War" and a 30-year search for accountability

Between 1975 to 1978, roughly 22,000 people were killed or forcibly disappeared during the course of Argentina's "Dirty War". Rosa Gomez and Antonio Savone were among the disappeared, and survivors of the secret prison known as the D2. Over 30 years after only knowing each other through the bars of their cells, Rosa and Antonio were reunited to testify when those responsible for their torture were finally put on trial for war crimes.

Come meet Rosa and Antonio, and hear their stories. They will be joined by Lorne Waldman, one of Canada's leading human rights lawyers, in their discussion of Argentina's struggle for reconciliation after mass atrocity and the long path to justice and accountability.
